

- Java Virtual Machine -> portability
- Compilation

Security Issues

- Mobile code use arises security concerns
- Hostile applets
 - attack the *Integrity* of the system
 - violate the *Privacy* of the user
 - limit the *Availability* of system resources
 - achieve user's *Annoyance*

Java Security

- JVM
 - applet classloader
 - bytecode verifier
 - security manager
- JDK 1.2
 - security policy
 - access permissions
 - protection domains

Java Security - Extensions

- User authentication
- Policy enforcement methods
 - capabilities
 - extended stack introspection
 - namespace management
- Secure Code Distribution
- Confining the use of Java in a network domain
- Digital Signatures

Proposed Security Enhancements

- configurable audit system
- facing degradation of service
- “authorisation fatigue” -> modification of security-related user interface
